

ICON PART-T International CONsensus on the recommended reporting standards for PARTicipant characteristics in Tendinopathy research

Currently there is no agreement on what to report in tendon studies!

We need adequate description of participant characteristics in a tendon study to be able to:

- identify precisely the phenotype being reported on
- directly implement findings into clinical practice - i.e. the generalizability
- pool studies' findings accurately
- potentially identify confounding factors in the study's data

What do I need to report?

Demographics

Age
Sex
Body Mass
Standing Height



Tendinopathy descriptors

Duration of symptoms
Severity of symptoms
Level of disability
Location of symptoms
Loading tests used



General health and comorbidities

Medication use history
Physical Activity Level
Presence of co-morbidities
History of tendinopathy
