Comorbidities and medication questioning guide

Asking about certain medical conditions and medications may have important implications for the underlying tendon problem. Many studies however do not adequately report these.

What do I need to ask?

Comborbidities

- Inflammatory or rheumatoid arthritis
- Psoriasis
- · Inflammatory bowel or eye disease
- Ankylosing Spondylitis
- Gout
- Diabetes (type 1 or 2) or impaired glucose sensitivity
- Hypertension or cardiac disease
- Hypertriglyceridemia and/or high cholesterol
- · Familial hypercholesterolemia
- · Collagen disorders such as Ehlers Danlos syndrome
- Fibromylagia





Medications

- Fluoroquinolone antibiotics (e.g. ciprofloxacin)
- Corticosteroids
- Anti-inflammatory medications
- Statin medication (for cholesterol)
- · Medication for diabetes
- Allopurinol (gout medication)
- · Aromatase inhibitors (used post breast cancer)
